## Notice of Referendum Election and

#### OFFICE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT CLERK

#### TO THE VOTERS OF PECATONICA AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Notice is hereby given of a referendum election to be held in the Pecatonica Area School District on November 3, 2020, at which the question, to be submitted to a vote for the referendum, is shown in the sample ballot below.

#### INFORMATION TO VOTERS

Upon entering the polling place, a voter shall state his or her name and address, show an acceptable form of photo identification and sign the poll book before being permitted to vote. If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles. If a voter is not registered to vote, a voter may register to vote at the polling place serving his or her residence, if the voter presents proof of residence in a form specified by law. Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot. Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall retire alone to a voting booth and cast his or her ballot except that a voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward. An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not in any manner advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

#### Where Paper Ballots are Used

The voter shall make a mark (X) in the square next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall make a mark (X) in the square next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using a *tactile ballot marking device (Vote-PAD)* to mark a **paper** ballot, the voter shall obtain from the inspectors, the assistive device and any audio or dexterity aids if required. The voter shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "no" if opposed to the question.

#### Where Optical Scan Voting is Used

The voter shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using an *electronic ballot marking device ("Automark," "ExpressVote," Clear Access or "ImageCast Evolution-ICE")* to mark an **optical scan** ballot, the voter shall touch the screen or use the keypad to select "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen or use the keypad to select "no" if opposed to the question.

#### Where Touch Screen Voting is Used

The voter shall touch the screen at "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen at "no" if opposed to the question.

The vote should not be cast in any other manner. Not more than five minutes' time shall be allowed inside a voting booth or machine. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in casting his or her vote may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

If the voter spoils a **paper or optical scan** ballot, he or she shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

The voter may spoil a **touch screen** ballot at the voting station before the ballot is cast.

**After Marking the Ballot**

After an official **paper** ballot is marked, it shall be folded so the inside marks do not show, but so the printed endorsements and inspectors' initials on the outside do show. The voter shall then deposit the ballot in the ballot box, or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit, and shall leave the polling place promptly.

After an official **optical scan** ballot is marked, it shall be inserted in the security sleeve, so the marks do not show. The voter shall then insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. If a central count system is used, the voter shall insert the ballot in the ballot box and discard the sleeve, or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

After an official **touch screen** ballot is marked, the voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting his or her vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that he or she is unable to read, has difficulty reading, writing or understanding English or that due to disability is unable to cast his or her ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter.

**RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A REFERENDUM ON THE QUESTION OF THE APPROVAL OF A RESOLUTION TO EXCEED REVENUE LIMIT BY \$490,000 BEGINNING IN 2021-2022 FOR A RECURRING PURPOSE**

WHEREAS, the School Board of the Pecatonica Area School District, Iowa, Lafayette, Green and Dane Counties, Wisconsin (the "District"), has heretofore duly adopted a resolution entitled: "Resolution Authorizing The School District Budget To Exceed The Revenue Limit By \$490,000 Beginning In 2021-2022 For A Recurring Purpose" (the "Revenue Limit Resolution");

WHEREAS, the School Board deems it to be desirable and in the best interest of the District to hold a referendum for the purpose of submitting the Revenue Limit Resolution to the electors for approval or rejection in conjunction with the Spring election; and,

WHEREAS, unless the Revenue Limit Resolution is approved by the electors, the District shall not include the excess revenue heretofore authorized pursuant to the Revenue Limit Resolution in the School District budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the District as follows:

Section 1. Referendum Date. The District Clerk is hereby directed to call a referendum election to be held in the District on Tuesday, November 3, 2020, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the District the proposition of whether the Revenue Limit Resolution shall be approved.

Section 2. Notice to Electors. The District Clerk is directed to give notice by:

- (a) causing a Type A Notice of Referendum in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A to be published in the District's official newspaper, **The Pecatonica Valley Leader**, in the issue published immediately prior to the fourth Tuesday before the referendum election (October 1, 2020).
- (b) causing a combination Type C, Type B and Type D Notice in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit B to be published in the District's official newspaper in the issue published immediately preceding the referendum election (October 29, 2020).

If any of the municipalities within the District use an electronic voting system employing a ballot label and a ballot card, the Type B Notice shall also include a true, actual-size ballot label and ballot card in the form in which they will appear on election day.

Such notices may be modified to allow a notice to be published together with another county or municipality as permitted by law.

Section 3. Other Notifications. The District Clerk is further directed to provide the following notifications:

- (a) Within ten (10) days of the adoption of the Revenue Resolution, the Department of

Public Instruction shall be notified of the scheduled date of the referendum and provided with a copy of said Revenue Resolution in the manner required by the Department and shall further notify the Department of the results of the referendum within 10 days following the election using the method required by the Department.

- (b) Not later than the next business day after this Resolution and the Referendum Resolution are filed with the School District Clerk, a copy of each resolution shall be filed with the County Clerks of Iowa, Lafayette and Dane Counties.

Section 4. Polling Places and Hours. The regular polling places for the municipalities located wholly or partially within the District are hereby designated as polling places to be used for this referendum election:

Section 5. Referendum Election Officials. The election officials appointed in each of the municipalities within the District in which the referendum is to be held shall conduct the election in each such municipality.

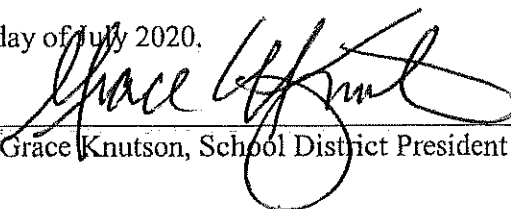
Section 6. Official Referendum Ballot Form. The ballot to be used at the referendum election shall be prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 5.64(2) and 7.08(1)(a) of the Wisconsin Statutes. The ballot shall be substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit C.

The District Clerk shall cause to be printed sufficient ballots for use at said referendum election, both as actual ballots and as absentee ballots as well as specimen ballots (the specimen ballots to be of a different and easily identifiable color from the actual ballot).

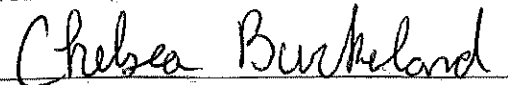
The municipal clerks of all the municipalities within the District shall receive applications for absentee ballots and initial the same when issued to qualified absentee voters.

Section 7. Canvass. The returns of the referendum election shall be canvassed by the Board of Canvassers of each municipality within the District in which the referendum election is held. Each Board of Canvassers shall certify the returns of the referendum election to the District Clerk. The District Clerk and two other reputable citizens appointed by the District Clerk shall act as the District's Board of Canvassers for this referendum election. This Board of Canvassers shall meet in open session not later than 9:00 a.m. on the Tuesday following the referendum to determine the result of the referendum election. The canvass shall be open to the public and the District Clerk is directed to give due notice of said meeting.

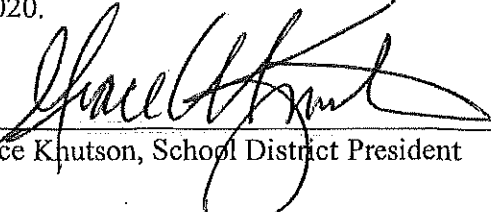

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that at an election to be held in the Pecatonica Area School District on November 3, 2020, the following proposed Revenue Limit Resolution of the School District Board of Education will be submitted to a vote of the people:

### **RESOLUTION TO EXCEED REVENUE LIMIT BY \$490,000 BEGINNING IN 2021-2022 FOR A RECURRING PURPOSE**

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the Pecatonica Area School District, Iowa, Lafayette, Green and Dane Counties, Wisconsin, that the revenues included in the school district budget be authorized to exceed the revenue limit imposed by Section 121.91 of the Wisconsin Statutes by an amount not to exceed \$490,000 beginning in 2021-2022 on a recurring basis for operational expenses, deferred maintenance projects, technology and curriculum improvement.

The question will appear on the ballot as follows:

“Shall the Pecatonica Area School District be Authorized To Exceed The Revenue Limit Specified In Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$490,000 Beginning in the 2021- 2022 School Year For Recurring Purposes?”

### EXPLANATION

The referendum election ballot will ask District electors to vote "yes" or "no" on the referendum election question as set forth above.

A "yes" vote on the question is in favor of the Resolution set forth above and is a vote to approve the School District having the authority to include in its budget \$490,000 more than the revenue cap would otherwise allow beginning In 2021-2022 for recurring purposes. Because this amount is for recurring purposes, a "yes" vote approves exceeding the revenue cap in the stated amount and that amount then becomes part of the base for determining the revenue limit in future years.

A "no" vote on the question is opposed to the Resolution set forth above and is a vote to deny the School District the authority to include in its budget \$490,000 more than the revenue cap would otherwise allow beginning In 2021-2022 for recurring purposes. A "no" vote opposes exceeding the revenue cap in the stated amount for recurring purposes and that amount would not then become part of the base for determining the revenue limit in future years.
